- 1st place - \$1500 per event
- 2nd place - \$1000 per event
- 3rd place - \$500 per event

FINA World Cup Series – Overall Prize Money

Prizes will be awarded to the top three scorers among men and women in the following amounts:

- Winner - \$50,000
- 2nd Place - \$30,000
- 3rd Place - \$20,000

The FINA points table will be used for this scoring. The best swim achieved by a swimmer will be counted. Only the swims performed during the finals will be considered. Only swimmers participating at one meet in each zone will be eligible for the FINA overall prize money.

World Record Bonus: For a top limit of 10 world records, a prize of \$4,000 will be awarded for each world record. If more than 10 world records are broken, the total fund of \$60,000 will be divided equally among the record-breakers. World records achieved at a split are not eligible for a bonus.

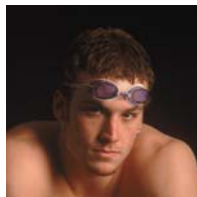
