

## **SEEING CHICAGO:**

Downtown is easily accessible by train. To take the train, exit the front door of the Hyatt Regency O'Hare and turn right. Walk to the light (River Road) and turn right. Continue under the expressway and the train station (Blue Line Train System) will be on the right. A one-day pass is \$5.00. A cab ride downtown costs \$30 each way. Here are some of the interesting sites and how to get there (allow one hour travel time each way):

Art Institute of Chicago – Blue line to the Monroe stop; walk 3 blocks east to Michigan Avenue; turn right and walk 1 block south to the museum

Millennium Park – Blue line to the Washington stop; your exit is the corner of Washington & Dearborn; walk 3 blocks east to the park

Navy Pier – Blue line to the Chicago stop; take Bus #66 to the Navy Pier stop; this bus line ends at Navy Pier

Sears Tower – Blue line to the Jackson stop; walk three blocks west to the Sears Tower

Field Museum – Blue line to the Jackson stop; walk 1 block east to State Street and board the #146 bus heading south to the museum

Wrigley Field (home of the Cubbies) – Blue line to Addison stop; take Wrigley Bus directly to the field

Theater District – Blue line to Clark/Lake stop; walk 2 blocks west to Dearborn Avenue (if you have a sense of where the lake is, East is towards the lake, West is away from the lake); South, the lake is on your left (North, the lake is on your right)

Chicago Cubs schedule: September 13 (Sunday) – Cincinnati at 1:20pm; Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday – Milwaukee at 7:05pm (Friday, Saturday, Sunday – at St. Louis)

Chicago White Sox schedule: September 18-19-20 (Friday, Saturday & Sunday) – Kansas City at 7:00pm (Friday), 6:00pm (Saturday) and 1:00pm (Sunday)

Chicago Bears schedule: September 20 (Sunday) – hosting the Pittsburgh Steelers
