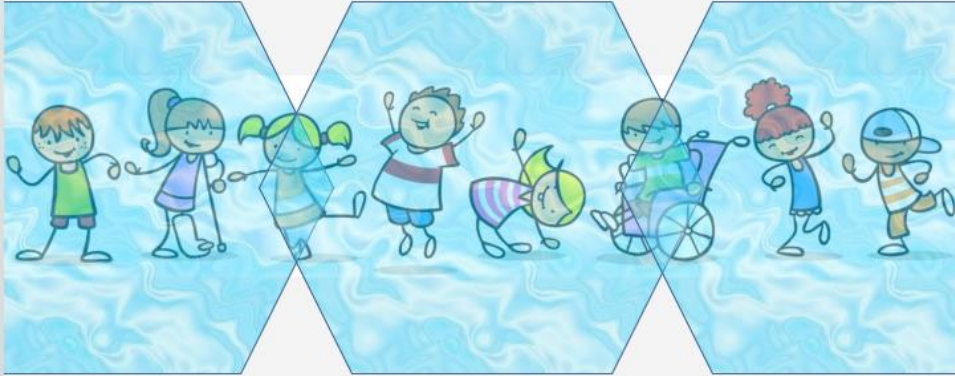

Children with challenges need swimming.

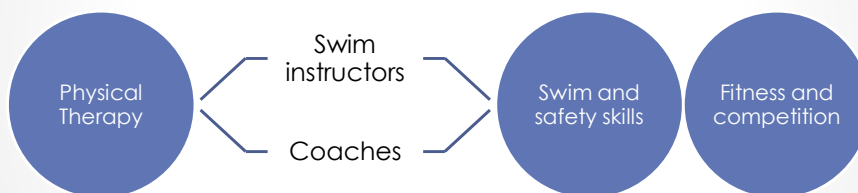

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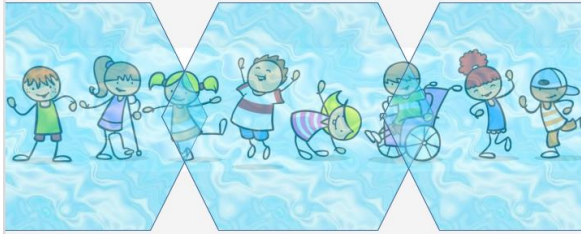

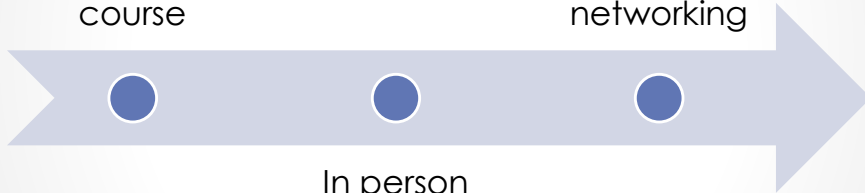

Workshop Overview

The Workshop is the second step in the Children With Challenges™ course, involving hands-on, interactive discussion and learning.

Workshop Objectives:

1. Gain an understanding of the aquatic continuum for children with challenges.
2. Successfully develop the pathways and relationships necessary for inclusiveness and successful transitions from one level of programming to the next.
3. Successfully create, implement and manage the primary bridges necessary for transition between programming levels while gaining an understanding of the athlete and provider opportunities, and perspectives for each.
4. Recognition of, and the ability to utilize all available resources (i.e., local and national agencies).
5. Successfully apply the practical knowledge utilized within the workshop to train program staff, and to better serve families and their children with challenges.
