Sigma Gamma Rho, Inc. Donates to USA Swimming Foundation

In October, senior leadership of the Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority visited Colorado Springs to meet with USA Swimming staff to discuss the growth of the four-year Swim 1922 partnership. Over the next quad, SGRho pledges to increase its member participation in the partnership by 20 percent, provide 22 annual swim scholarships, create a Swim 1922 public service announcement and host a Swim 1922 Swim Safety day. As part of the visit, the sorority generously donated \$1,922 dollars to the USA Swimming Foundation as a commitment to learn to swim programming. With 500 nationwide chapters, the sorority has hosted informational 'Swimming in the Deep' seminars and conducted swim lesson events across the country with Olympic medalist and SGRho member Maritza McClendon.
