23	WELCOME / MEETING OVERVIEW
24 25	Mr. Shackley welcomed the Board members and remarked how nice it is to see people in-person.
26	Tim Hinchey III, President & CEO of USA Swimming and the USA Swimming Foundation, gave his
27	welcome and echoed Mr. Shackley's sentiments.

29	Lucinda McRoberts, USA Swimming Foundation Executive Director, reflected on the year-to-date for the
30	Foundation and cited record distribution of funds across all programs. Ms. McRoberts spoke to the staff
31	transition that has taken place and referenced the comprehensive evaluation of Foundation
32	programming that is being undertaken.

NATIONAL TEAM PRESENTATION

- 43 Lindsay Mintenko, National Team Managing Director, thanked the Foundation for its support. Ms.
- 44 Mintenko recapped the past summer's accomplishments, highlighting the medal hauls from FINA World
- 45 Championships in Budapest and Duel in the Pool in Australia. Ms. Mintenko reviewed the calendar
- 46 between now and Paris and shared excitement about hosting in-person National Team onboardings for
- 47 the first time ever.

Stacy Michael-Miller, Director of National Team & Support Services, spoke to the importance of having a transition program to assist athletes moving into the next phase of their career and highlighted the importance of mental health and the loss of identity when one leaves the sport. Ms. Michael-Miller described what USA Swimming is currently doing to help (e.g., career counseling, networking, internship placements, financial literacy trainings) and reported that the development of a transition program for all athletes that have represented USA Swimming nationally is underway. Ms. Michael-Miller indicated that the goal is to launch this program in early 2023.

Ms. Mintenko then talked about the National Team's emphasis on relays in the leadup to the 2024 Olympics in Paris. Ms. Mintenko spoke to FINA's qualifying process and how the goal is to win gold in every relay in Paris. The plan is to financially incentivize relays at 2023 FINA World Championships to best position the team for Paris. Ms. Mintenko then outlined the financial investment desired for both the transitionary program and the relay incentives.

FINANCE / INVESTMENT REPORTS

Eric Skufca, Chief Financial Officer, gave the financial overview and update noting that year-to-date financial results and projections are directionally consistent with expectations. Mr. Skufca said that while investments are down as a by-product of the volatile market, the investment committee is taking a proactive approach monitor and manage the asset. Mr. Skufca shared that the investment portfolio is on pace to beat the one-year and three-year benchmarks.

Ms. McRoberts referenced and thanked the working group that helped determine action steps regarding the 2021 budget surplus. Ms. McRoberts emphasized the need to balance how the Foundation supports programs in real time and continues to grow its investments.

Ms. McRoberts then presented findings on the budget process from her review of the Foundation's governing documents. In summary, the Foundation Board is responsible for approving certain spending minimums. Ms. McRoberts acknowledged the ambiguity of current policies and announced that a working group to resolve inconsistencies will be formed in the future. Ms. McRoberts confirmed that the 2023 budget will be presented at the next board meeting in November.

MOTION: To approve the following program and Board related expenses to be included in the 2023 budget presented in November of 2022: \$500K to Youth Learn-to-Swim Grants, \$130K to Adult Learn-to-

Swim Grants, \$1M to National Team Support, \$260K to Sport Development/Community Impact Grants & Support, and \$30K to Board of Directors and Audit/Tax Fees. Seconded. APPROVED.

BOARD GOVERNING POLICIES UPDATE / PILLAR WORKING GROUPS

Ms. McRoberts spoke to the current inconsistencies in Foundation governing documents and asked for volunteers to serve on a committee to resolve inconsistencies. Several Board members volunteered.

DIRECTOR AND OFFICER ELECTIONS

Ms. McRoberts reviewed current demographics of the Foundation Board and emphasized a desire to diversify aspects of its composition. Mr. Shackley opened a discussion regarding whether any Board members had potential names in mind to add to the Board.

US MASTERS SWIMMING PARTNERSHIP UPDATES

Dawson Hughes, CEO of U.S. Masters Swimming (USMS), provided an update on USMS activities. Mr. Hughes highlighted the USMS annual meeting in Denver last week and covered details of what came out of that meeting. Mr. Hughes reported on increased interest in grants and current plans for meeting the demand. USMS has raised about \$40k in fundraising so far this year, with November and December traditionally being the largest months. Mr. Jay DeFinis estimated that over the last 10 years, \$1 million total has been awarded to Adult Learn-to-Swim efforts.

SWIM-A-THON REPORT

Nick Gold, Foundation Development Coordinator, presented updates to the group on the Swim-a-Thon program and its 2022 operating procedures. Mr. Gold highlighted the Swim-a-Thon grand prize winner, Seward Tsunami, and reviewed the visit to Alaska. Mr. Gold reported that while not yet at pre-pandemic fundraising levels, the Foundation has already received over \$175K in donations through the program in 2022 and is trending in the right direction.

FOUR PILLARS UPDATE

GENERATE REVENUE

Ms. McRoberts provided an overview of fundraising totals to date and provided updates to the various fundraising dashboards and emerging opportunities, such as Online Membership Registration donations and "Charity of Choice" agreements.

MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN COMMUNITIES

Joel Shinofield, Managing Director of Sport Development, spoke to the increased growth of the
Community Impact grant program, with the goal to reach 10 HBCUs this year. Mr. Shinofield emphasized
the importance of connection at these HBCUs and highlighted the challenge of finding enough staff for
these clubs.

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134	SUPPORT FACILITIES AND POOLS
135	Ms. McRoberts detailed the ways in which the Foundation is currently supporting facilities, including the
136	almost finished video of USA Swimming Foundation Ambassadors Rowdy Gaines and Missy Franklin
137	speaking about the benefits a pool can bring to a community. Ms. McRoberts emphasized the
138	importance of pursuing donor-led developments to help support USA Swimming strategic planning in
139	this space.
