Dear Friends of the Foundation,

2025 was a landmark year for USA Swimming, the USA Swimming Foundation, and for swimmers of every age and ability.

Because of your generosity, we expanded access, strengthened communities, and supported athletes competing on the world's biggest stages.

Saving Lives

Swimming is a lifesaving skill, and your support continues to make that mission possible. In 2025, we awarded **\$880,000** in **Learn-to-Swim Grants**, supporting 114 lesson providers across 40 states and reaching more than 13,500 children and adults. These grants prioritize communities with limited access to water, ensuring more people have the opportunity to learn this essential skill.

Impacting Communities

We continued to expand access in underserved areas through **Community Impact Grants** and support for Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). This year, we invested in **35 community programs and 8 HBCU teams**, helping grow the sport and create pathways for more athletes.

For the first time, we also engaged coach mentors to support Community Swim Teams in Los Angeles and Chicago, further strengthening access to competitive swimming.

Building Champions

On the international stage, Team USA delivered record-breaking performances at the World Championships in Singapore. Many of these athletes benefited from the Donor Athlete Partnership Program (DAPP), which supports their training, recovery, and long-term success. Your support plays a direct role in helping these athletes reach their full potential.

All of this was possible because of you.

Looking ahead, the momentum continues. In 2026, we will bring the TYR Pro Swim Series to communities nationwide, host the Toyota National Championships, and welcome top international athletes to the Pan Pacific Championships in Irvine, California.

We invite you to stay connected to our athletes and the impact of your support throughout the year. From special events to opportunities to engage with our leadership and athletes, you will see firsthand how your generosity is making a difference.

For more than 20 years, your support has shaped the journeys of swimmers from their first lesson to the Olympic podium. Thank you for being an essential part of this work as we continue to save lives, build champions, and impact communities.

We look forward to continuing this work together in 2026.

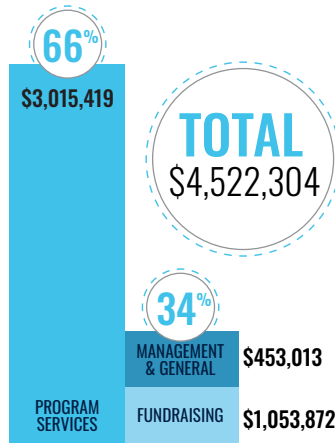

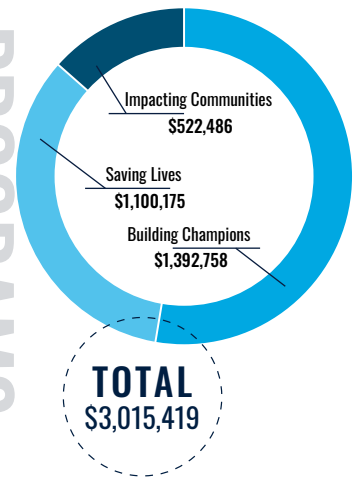

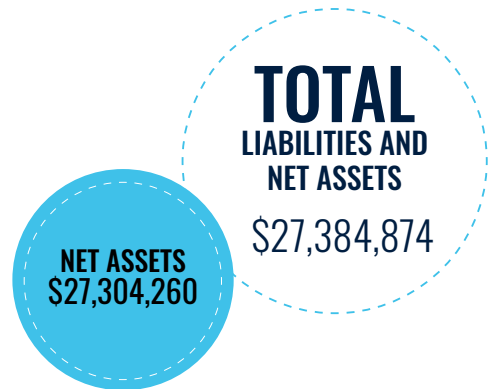

The grant allowed us to remove barriers for families who could not otherwise afford swim lessons. Transportation and lesson fees were fully covered, ensuring every student had equal access. By expanding access, the Learn to Swim initiative is closing safety and opportunity gaps in our community, especially for students from historically underserved backgrounds."

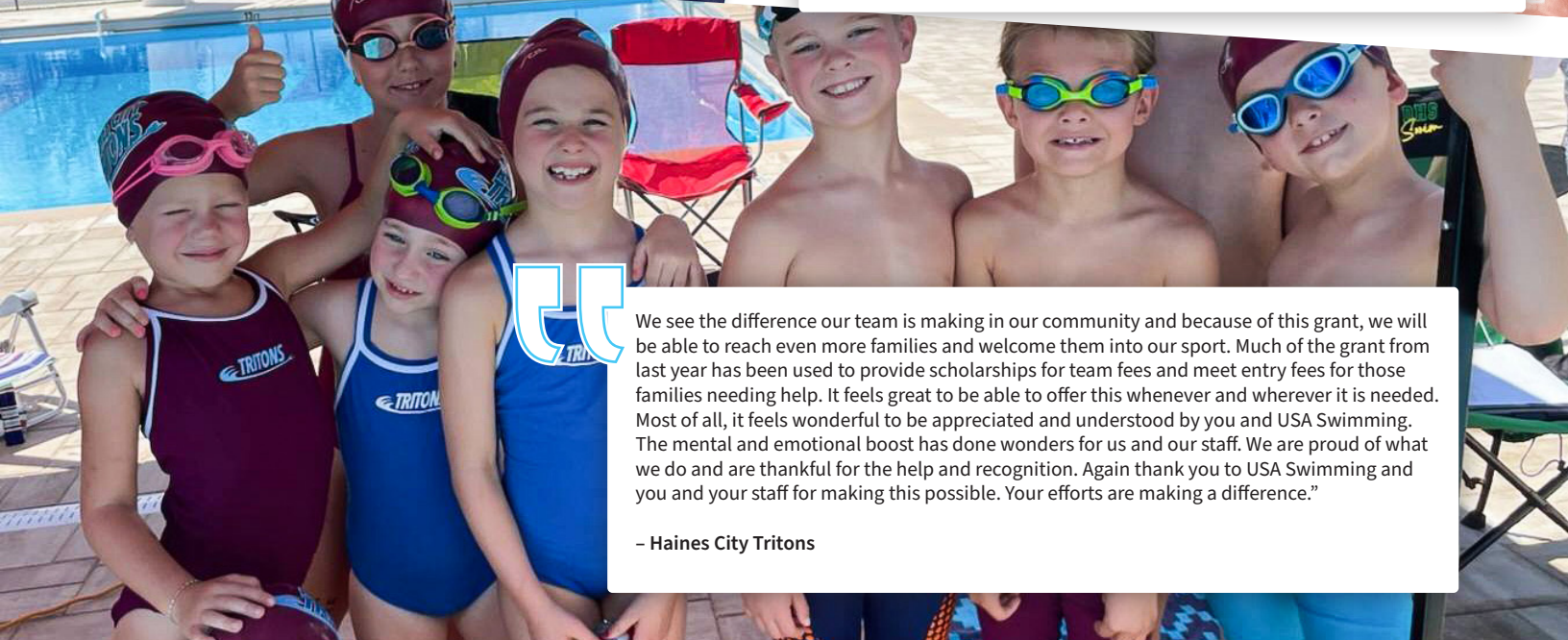
