- 1. The legislative items will be considered in block order.
- 2. Section A contains items which have been withdrawn by the maker. If there is no objection from the House, the items will be considered withdrawn.
- Sections B will be considered as omnibus motions, except for those items pulled for discussion. Within the block, delegates will be given the opportunity to pull items. Section C will be considered one item at a time. Changes to the rules adopted because of changes by FINA are informational only and are not included in any block.
- 4. Items pulled will be considered in numerical order after the respective omnibus motion.
- 5. Omnibus motions are in the affirmative as motions to approve the block of items.
- 6. Other motions should generally be stated in the affirmative.
- 7. Any amendment requires simple majority for approval. The subsequent amended main motion will require the original percentage (majority, 2/3 or 90%). An entirely new item will require 90% for adoption.
- If you wish to speak, please move to an available microphone. Once recognized by the Chair, please identify yourself by name and LSC or committee.
- 9. When a badge count is used, please raise your hand high and keep it still until the count is complete. During a badge count, please do not move from your original position.
- 10. A main motion may only have two amendments pending at any one time.

The makers have requested these items be withdrawn. If there is no objection, a motion authorizing withdrawal of these items will be considered passed EXCEPT if pulled.

 - .1 **Preliminary Heats When Finals are Scheduled** Entry times shall be listed by the meet committee with the fastest swimmer first and the slowest swimmer last. Swimmers whose submitted times are identical should be assigned places in the list by draw. Swimmers with no submitted times shall be considered the slowest and shall be placed at the end of the list by draw. Swimmers shall be seeded in lanes under the procedure outlined for finals seeding in 102.5. Swimmers shall be seeded in heats according to submitted times in the following manner:

A Fewer than three heats

- (1) If there is only one heat, it shall be swum as scheduled during the preliminaries and finals.

- C Four heats or more Except for 400y, 400m/500y, 800m/1000y and 1500m/1650y events, the last fastest three heats of an event shall be seeded in accordance with B above. The heat preceding the last fastest three heats shall consist of the next fastest swimmers; the heat preceding the last fastest four heats shall consist of the next fastest swimmers, etc. Lanes shall be assigned in descending order of submitted times within each heat, in accordance with the pattern outlined in 102.5.
- D For 400y, 400m/500y, 800m/1000y and 1500m/1650y events, the last fastest two heats of an event shall be seeded in accordance with 102.5.1A(2). The heat preceding the fastest two heats shall consist of the next fastest swimmers; the heat preceding the fastest three heats shall consist of the next fastest swimmers, etc. Lanes shall be assigned in descending order of submitted times within each heat, in accordance with the pattern outlined in 102.5
- Exception When there are two or more heats in an event, there shall be a minimum of three swimmers seeded into any one preliminary heat, but subsequent scratches may reduce the number of swimmers in such heat to less than three.

These orders may 195 be made effective pending full hearings by the Zone Board of Review or the conclusion of administrative or judicial 196 proceedings of other bodies addressing the same or similar issues or on other terms as determined by the Zone Board of 197 198 .3 Grounds for Imposition - The Zone Board of Review may fashion remedies and orders and impose penalties with 199 respect to any Group or Individual Member of the Zone, or Participating Non-Member residing within the Zone (1) who has 200 violated any of the regulations, rules, policies or procedures of the LSC, Zone, USA Swimming or FINA, including any of the 201 responsibilities of membership set forth in the Required LSC Bylaws, (2) who aids, abets, instigates or encourages another 202 to violate any of such regulations, rules or policies, (3) who is responsible for any such violation by another, or (4) who has 203 acted in a manner which has brought, or may bring, into disrepute the LSC, the Zone, USA Swimming or the sport of

- 243 (1) **Swimsuits** A total of two three separate advertising logos of a maximum size of 30 square centimeters (4.65 sq. in.) each, measured as worn, shall be permitted.
 - (2) **Caps** A total of two three separate advertising logos of a maximum size of 20 square centimeters (3.1 sq. in.) each, as measured as applied, shall be permitted. A club logo is not considered as advertising and is not subject to the size limitations.
 - (3) **Goggles** A total of two three separate advertising logos of a maximum size of 6 square centimeters (.9 sq. in.) each, as measured as applied, shall be permitted, but only on the spectacle frame or band.
 - B Body advertising in the form of temporary tattoos or other embellishments is not allowed.
 - C Advertising for the following shall not be allowed:
 - (1) Products involving tobacco, nicotine, psychoactive cannabinoids, alcohol or pharmaceuticals containing substances banned under IOC or FINA rules;
 - (2) Political statements; and
 - (3) Any products or services that would be counter to the values of the sport or bring disrepute to USA Swimming.

RESOLUTION REGARDING USA SWIMMING CLUB MEMBERSHIP FEE INCREASE

EFFECTIVE DATE: September 1, 2020 for the 2021 Membership Year

"WHEREAS, we desire that the United States continue to be recognized as the #1 swimming nation in the world; and

WHEREAS, USA Swimming desires to continue to be recognized as being among the flagship National Governing Bodies in the U.S. Olympic Committee's family of sports; and

WHEREAS, the current fee schedule for USA Swimming clubs is set at \$70 per membership year; and

WHEREAS, club membership fees have been a funding source for USA Swimming's successful efforts over the past decade to meet the objectives of Building the Base, Promoting the Sport, and Achieving Sustained Competitive Success in International Competition; and

WHEREAS, USA Swimming's club membership fees have not been adjusted for more than 30 years; and

WHEREAS, USA Swimming also seeks to continue the expansion of its programs, services and support for clubs, including Safe Sport and insurance;

WHEREAS, the USA Swimming Board of Directors has approved the proposal to increase club membership fees to the following levels beginning with the 2021 membership year:

- For existing clubs from \$70 to \$250
- For new, first-year clubs only, from \$70 to \$500
- For seasonal clubs from \$40 to \$70

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the USA Swimming House of Delegates approve a fee increase for annual club members beginning in the 2021 membership year."

CHANGES TO CORPORATE BYLAWS OF USA SWIMMING AS AMENDED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS [Informational Only]

2.6 PRIVILEGES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERSHIP

- .1 A Coach member of USA Swimming must be at least eighteen (18) years of age. Junior Coach members must be age sixteen (16) or seventeen (17).
- .2 All non-athlete members of USA Swimming must have satisfactorily completed criminal background checks and athlete protection education as required by USA Swimming. The criminal background check requirement is waived for Junior Coach members.
- .3 All adult members of USA Swimming, including athletes, and junior coach members must have satisfactorily completed athlete protection education as required by the U.S. Center for SafeSport.
- .3 4 All clubs, including seasonal clubs, shall ensure that all athletes and coaches participating in practices and USA Swimming sanctioned competition are members of USA Swimming.
- .4 5 All referees, starters, administrative officials, chief judges, and stroke and turn judges must be non-athlete members of USA Swimming.
- .6 Employees and volunteers of USA Swimming, Zones, LSCs and member clubs who interact directly and frequently with athletes as a regular part of their duties and individuals with any ownership interest in a member club must be non-athlete members of USA Swimming. This does not apply to volunteers such as timers, marshals, computer operators, etc., who only have limited contact with athletes during a meet; however, any individual who is banned, currently suspended or ineligible for membership is prohibited from serving as a timer, marshal, or computer operator, or otherwise being on deck at any time in connection with a USA Swimming activity.
